# Canoga Campus becomes shelter from the firestorm



News at Eleven - As brush fires raged through the hills of Chatsworth, Bell Canyon, Moorpark and other areas of the southland, the American Red Cross set up evacuation shelters at Pierce College and Canoga Park High School.

By Thursday morning, dozens of families whose homes were threatened by the fires had gathered in the big gym and all facilities in the PE area were given over to aid in the effort.

Local and network news crews came and went throughout Wednesday night and into Thursday, covering the first major event of the fire season in Southern California for 2005.

### **Budget Crisis: Snack food revenues lost**


The loss of income from the sale of snack foods has affected virtually every school activity, making it harder to purchase band uniforms, provide budgets for athletic teams and fund many other programs.

Even though Gatorade and water machines are still around, these healthier alternatives haven't been consumed much by students so our school is still down by \$30,000. Advisors and coaches are hoping to raise the necessary money by arranging more fundraisers.

Canoga Park Principal, Dr. Thompson, said: "Canoga Park students deserve nothing but the best." He went on to say, "if our school can't sell snacks to raise money, then the district should provide the money for uniforms and other utilities needed".

Compounding this problem is the smaller number of students attending Canoga High this year. The district provides money to each school according to the population of students in the school: the more students, the more money, and the less students, the less money. But many of last year's traveling students left Canoga to attend South Central High or other schools in L.A. Along with a general reduction in student registration throughout the district, this creates additional problems because we're not receiving as much money as before.

On the bar graph above you can see the expenses and the money taken



from our school savings (surplus) from 1998 to 2005.

Our student store manager explained to us how expenses have been increasing every year and our profits weren't as high.

# Fewer students enroll in 2005

As many students have heard, Canoga Park has a smaller population of students this year compared to 2004-2005. Last year, Canoga enrolled approximately 2300 students. This year, as of September 13, only 1875 Hunters had shown up.

We are about 450 students short. Yet neither the school nor the district can fully explain where all of the kids are. Originally, Canoga was told by the district to plan for a larger number of students. In meetings with district officials, Canoga Assistant Principal, Ms. Wallace, was told that the student population just "went poof."

The school administration, in trying to deal with the problem, must close classes and transfer some teachers to other schools. About 60 classes are closing and about 12 teachers are being transferred to other schools.

Mr. Jordan will be going to Birmingham, Mr. Gwinn will transfer to Monroe's continuation school, all of Ms. Westernoff's classes for this semester are being closed, some Academy classes have been eliminated for now, Ms Braham's 0 period has also been closed, along with many other classes.

According to Canoga Park Assistant Principal, Ms. Wallace, the district said Canoga's student population "just went poof."

Eagle Rock added a late field goal to make the final score 24-15.

Varsity running back, Reggie Green, summarized the game in his own words: "Before the game I felt excited and pumped up, during the whole game I felt excited, after the game I was mad, but I look forward to the next game."
